## MINUTES

## Regular Board Meeting

The Sandhills Board of Education regular meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. All board members were present. Also present were Dallas Watkins of Ameritas; Dan Morrell and Tammy Wobig of Conditioned Air Mechanical; and Superintendent Dale Hafer.

## Consent Agenda:

Michelle Milleson moved and Jeff Martindale seconded to approve the consent agenda. The motion passed 6-0.

## Administrative Report:

Superintendent/Principal's Report:
a. Supt. Hafer discussed/facilitated the following discussion items:

1. Dallas Watkins provided additional information regarding low interest financing options available through Ameritas to finish HS HVAC project.
2. Dan Morrell answered questions related to current HVAC capacities, requirements, and abilities to adapt to future needs.
3. Mr. Hafer reviewed the Advanc-Ed External Review Report with focus on the school's power practices and required actions.
4. NASB e-Meetings service was discussed with Mr. Hafer agreeing to bring more information and specific pricing to the June board meeting.
5. Board President Anderson read a "thank you" card from the elementary teachers showing their appreciation for attending reading conference.
6. Available inventory and pricing possibilities for buses will be brought and discussed at the June meeting.
7. Mr. Hafer updated the board on necessary adjustments to the HS class schedule as well as current status of schedules, related to paraprofessional use, at the elementary.
8. The board was updated on the current hiring and vacancies situation in that the Language Arts position had been offered but no candidate secured as of yet.
9. Mr. Hafer encouraged the board to attend the NASB School Law Seminar.
10. Mr. Hafer discussed superintendent based leadership training with the board noting the board's support for professional development and the superintendents willingness to continue to grow and improve.

S-T Coop: The COOP advisory committee met April $23^{\text {rd }}$ at Halsey Elementary. Updates regarding coaching assignments were discussed as well as details regarding an assistant athletic director and the use of "High School Cube" to stream activities live via the internet.

## New Business:

a. No patrons were present for purposes to address the board.
b. Jeff Martindale moved and Tedd Teahon seconded to direct Superintendent Hafer to advertise for proposals, with service agreements, to complete the new HVAC project at the High School Building. The motion passed 6-0.
c. It was moved by Michelle Milleson and seconded by Tedd Teahon to approve Ameritas to provide new HVAC project financing options for consideration at the June regular board meeting. The motion passed 6-0.
d. The $2^{\text {nd }}$ reading of board policy 1005.07 was tabled until the June or July board meetings.
e. Tedd Teahon moved and Jeff Martindale seconded to accept, with regret, the resignation of language arts teacher Joe Hamik. The motion passed 6-0.
f. The item of business related to automatic sprinklers was tabled until the June or July board meetings.
g. Tyson Cox moved and Michelle Milleson seconded to approve the ability to allow $6^{\text {th }}$ grade students to participate in Junior High Athletics according to Rule 10 guidelines and regulations. The motion passed 6-0.
h. Board President Anderson adjourned the meeting at 11:18 p.m.
