



It's FAFSA Time!

If you're a college-bound senior, you must complete the <u>FAFSA</u> (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) to apply for state, federal and college-based financial aid. Submit the form before your college's FAFSA priority date (typically between March 1 and April 1) as some financial aid is awarded first-come, first-served. Check with your college to learn their specific date.

Follow these steps to complete the FAFSA:

Complete your taxes early as the FAFSA requires current tax information. Within three weeks after you and your parents file your tax forms, your IRS data should be available to retrieve and transfer into your FAFSA through the <u>IRS Data Retrieval</u> process.

Gather these student and parent items:

- 2014 federal income tax forms and, if applicable, Schedule K-1 (Form 1065)
- 2014 W-2 forms
- Student's driver's license number
- Social Security numbers
- Birth dates
- Date parents were married, separated, divorced or widowed
- Current cash, savings and checking account balances
- Current investment values (stocks, bonds, mutual funds, CDs, etc.) excluding your home and retirement accounts
- Value of business (if more than 100 employees)
- Value of investment farm (Do not include the value of a family farm that you or your parents live on and operate.)
- 2014 child support (paid and/or received)
- 2014 Workers' Compensation
- Other untaxed income in 2014 such as housing/food/ living allowances for military and clergy
- Alien Registration Number for eligible non-citizens

Be prepared to answer the following FAFSA question:

Did you or anyone in your household receive any of the following federal benefits?

- Supplemental Security Income
- SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program)
- TANF ((Temporary Assistance for Needy Families))
- Free or Reduced Price Lunch
- WIC (Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children)

Complete and file the FAFSA at <u>FAFSA.gov</u>. The colleges you list on the application will receive the results.


